Statement on the Use of “Conflict Minerals”

The Prince and Izant Company is aware of the “Senate Bill on Financial Reform” which addresses a prohibition on acquiring “Conflict Materials” associated in any way with the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Africa and the human rights issues currently affecting that country.

We take very seriously the concerns that profits from illegal metals mining (“conflict materials”) may be fueling these human rights atrocities in the Eastern Region of the Democratic Republic of the Congo, and that such conflict materials could make their way into our supply chain.

The Prince and Izant Company expect our suppliers to only source materials from environmentally and socially responsible suppliers, and have taken action to ensure that our suppliers comply with these expectations.

Prince and Izant does not, and will never knowingly use conflict minerals and will regularly survey our suppliers to verify our requirements are being met.
